to Race Point

Dear Mr. Gibbs:

Please excuse the delay in answering your letter of March 17. We believe that your requirements, as outlined in this letter, are not large enough to preclude our favorable consideration.

We are concerned from a long-range point of view, and by long-range I mean the twenty-five years hence relative to our water supply. If, for instance, big demands should be increased in the next twenty-five years by as much as 50% more than the present requirements, our present supply would then be inadequate to meet the demand. We assume that the National Seashore would be willing:

1. For us to make exploration for additional water supply within the confines of the National Seashore and

2. In the event that our engineers located additional supply within the confines of the National Seashore, we further assume that you would be willing for us to build pumping facilities and make use of such supply.

Our best wishes for your planned developments at Race Point.

Please advise us with respect to additional water supply.

Dear Mr. Hancock:

We are enclosing for your information a copy of water requirement estimates prepared by engineers in our Design Office in Philadelphia. As you will note these estimates have been prepared through 1970.

It appears to me these estimates are very much on the liberal side. I am confident our water use would be much less than the amounts shown. I believe these estimates have been figured on a full-use capacity whereas the summer season lasts only about ten weeks, and the comfort stations are open only about three months. In addition there are also many cool days throughout this period when there is very little beach use.

We are also enclosing a sketch showing the areas to which we are requesting water line extensions within the next two years. It will be appreciated if you will review this matter and advise us as to your decision concerning our request for these extensions.

Memorandum

To: Superintendent, Cape Cod

From: Chief Engineer, EODC

Subject: Additional Water Requirements, Provincelands Area, Cape Cod

During our discussions in this office on March 1, you advised that you were planning on again contacting the officials of Provincetown regarding the possibility of securing water from them for our future needs in the Provincelands Area. Following are our estimates of water requirements for the various areas which could feasibly be served by one water main connected to the existing main at the Provincelands sub-maintenance area and constructed adjacent to the existing Race Point road from the utility area to Race Point.
